### **Commission Reorganization**

Human Welfare and Community Action Commission (HWCAC) and Peace and Justice Commission (PJC) Commission Merger and Reform



- Council directed staff to merge the HWCAC and PJC at their June 15, 2021 meeting.
- Staff commission merger development. Staff drafted a new commission ordinance combining key responsibilities of the HWCAC and PJC, as well as Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) funding requirements.
  - A memo was sent to both the HWCAC and PJC in November 2023 including the background, reasoning, and tentative timeline for the merger.
  - Agenda items were included for both the HWCAC's and PJC's Feb 2024 meetings to discuss the merger.
  - Commissioners met with commission secretaries to discuss concerns and provide input.

### **Commission Reorganization**

Human Welfare and Community Action Commission (HWCAC) and Peace and Justice Commission (PJC) Commission Merger and Reform

## Background

- Staff are providing two new ordinance options for moving the Council-directed commission merger forward while ensuring that the CSBG funding requirements currently being held in the HWCAC are met.
  - Option A. In response to concerns raised by HWCAC and PJC commissioners,
    Option A will merge the HWCAC and PJC while maintaining the key areas of interest and priorities of each commission.
  - **Option B.** In the case that Option A is not approved, Option B will make necessary revisions to the existing HWCAC ordinance to ensure CSBG funding compliance.

### Option A Commission Merger between the HWCAC and PJC

Key revised commission ordinance provisions

- New name "Human Welfare, Peace and Justice Commission"
- Inclusion of HWCAC and PJC priorities and responsibilities.
- Inclusion of CSBG-required responsibilities.

#### Rationale

- The current CSBG-related requirements held by the HWCAC are not being met and put this funding at risk.
- Council directed staff to merge the HWCAC and PJC and reduce the number of seats to 9.
- Both the HWCAC and PJC have had long-term commission vacancies.
- Achieve administrative efficiencies for staff while maintaining citizen oversight on matters of human welfare and peace and justice.

# Option B Reform of the HWCAC

#### **Key Changes to Ordinance**

- Reduction in commission membership from 15 to nine.
- Clarification of tripartite board composition.
- Clarification of CSBG required activities and responsibilities.

#### Rationale

- The HWCAC acts as the tripartite board for Berkeley's CSBG funding, which brings in approximately \$300K per year for programs that benefit low-income people.
- The long-term vacancies on the HWCAC are in violation of CSBG funding requirements and put this funding at risk.
